



Compensation hope for hearing impaired former Foden workers

Workers at the former Foden truck plant are set to receive help to cope with hearing loss sustained while working at the Sandbach factory.

Dozens of former Foden workers have sought help from industrial compensation specialists Attwood Solicitors.
